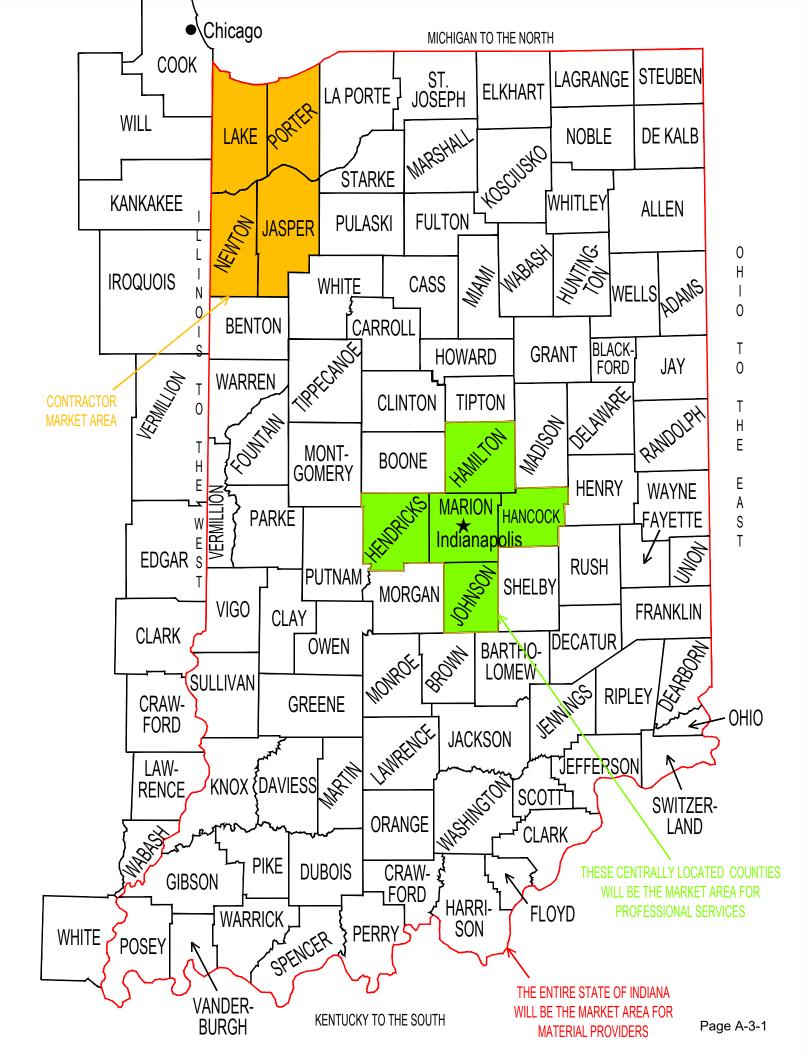

### Step 2: Adjustments to Step 1 Base Figure

After calculating a base figure of the relative availability of DBEs, evidence was examined to determine what, if any, adjustment to the base figure was needed in order to arrive at the overall goal. This effort weights the percentages based on the amount of work for each trade. This prevents an oversaturated pool of firms with a small amount of work from skewing the overall total. By the same token, it corrects for a diluted pool of firms and provides the best opportunity to predict actual outcomes to be expected.

The proposed Overall DBE Goal is as follows:

To arrive at an overall goal, we added our Step 2 base figure with our Historical Participation figure and then averaged the total arriving at an overall goal of 13.15%. We feel this adjusted goal figure will accurately reflect DBE participation that can be achieved for the type of project work being awarded during this three-year period.

Further, there are no applicable disparity studies for the local market area or recent legal case information available from the State of Indiana Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) to show any evidence of barriers to entry or competitiveness of DBEs in the utilized counties.

Breakout of Estimated "Race and Gender Neutral" (RN) and "Race and Gender Conscious" (RC) Participation.

**Gary/Chicago International Airport Authority (Gary/Chicago Airport)** will meet the maximum feasible portion of the overall goal by using RN means of facilitating DBE participation.

- 1. Arranging solicitations, times for the presentation of bids, quantities, specifications, and delivery schedules in ways that facilitates DBE, and other small businesses, participation;
- 2. Establishing an outreach program to inform firms, particularly in fields in which DBE participation has historically been low;
- 3. Ensuring distribution of DBE directory, through print and electronic means, to the widest feasible universe of potential prime contractors;

**Gary/Chicago International Airport Authority (Gary/Chicago Airport)** estimates that in meeting the established overall goal of **13.15%**, it will obtain 0.00% from RN participation and 13.15% through RC measures.

This breakout is based on:

**Gary/Chicago International Airport Authority (Gary/Chicago Airport)** does not have a history of DBE participation or over-achievement of goals to reference and expects to obtain its DBE participation through the use of DBE contract goals or a conscious effort to obtain DBE participation. Therefore, the entire goal of 13.15% is to be obtained through race-conscious participation.

**Gary/Chicago International Airport Authority (Gary/Chicago Airport)** will monitor DBE participation on an ongoing basis during the goal period and adjust the estimated breakout of RN and RC DBE participation as needed.

### **CONSULTATION AND PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

In establishing the overall goal, Gary/Chicago International Airport Authority (Gary/Chicago Airport) has or will provide for consultation and publication. This process included consultation with minority, women's, and general contractor groups, community organizations, and other officials or organizations which could be expected to have information concerning the availability of disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged businesses, the effects of discrimination on opportunities for DBEs, and the Gary/Chicago International Airport Authority's (Gary/Chicago Airport) efforts to establish a level playing field for the participation of DBEs. The consultation included a scheduled, direct, interactive exchange with as many interested stakeholders as possible, focused on obtaining information relevant to the goal-setting process, and was conducted before the goal methodology was submitted to the operating administration for review. Details of the consultation process are as follows.
